Odd and Even numbers **Answers**

Helpful hint - using small things such as Lego blocks, sweets or any small toys can help you when trying to answer a question. They don't even have to be the same things they just need to make up a number of things to share. Remember to ask a trusted grown up if you need help.

- 1) All of these children want to play a game of basketball together. Will the teams have the same number of children? YES or **NO** There will be 4 in one team and 5 in the other



- 2) Is the total number of children above an ODD or EVEN number? **ODD. There are 9 in total**

- 3) Are there an ODD or EVEN number of sweets here? **ODD. There are 11 in total**



- 4) How many of the sweets above would Sally and Billy each get if they were to have the same number each? **They would get 5 each with one left over**

- 5) Which numbers on a dice are ODD and which numbers are EVEN?



**1, 3 and 5 are odd
2, 4 and 6 are even**

- 6) With a set of 2 dice



what ODD numbers can be thrown when added together and what EVEN numbers? Hint - 1 is an odd number but can't be thrown using 2 dice.

ODD 3 5 7 9 11 EVEN 2 4 6 8 10 12

- 7) Draw a circle around the ODD numbers 7 24 15 11 8 19 2 20 3

- 8) Draw a circle around the EVEN numbers 11 6 12 15 1 13 22 2 19

- 9) This trailer can only carry 27 toys on it.
(remember how we can tell if any number is odd or even)



Is that an ODD or EVEN number? **ODD**

- 10) Fill in the missing odd numbers 1 3 5 7 9 11 13 15

- 11) Fill in the missing even numbers 2 4 6 8 10 12 14 16
